Community college students will receive \$1000. CSU or UC students will receive \$1500. The applicant must have a goal of pursuing a career in the field of education. Scholarship checks will be awarded upon receipt of the student's proof of acceptance and enrollment for the fall semester including a class schedule of at least 12 units.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of:

1. Financial need
2. Scholastic record
3. School extra curricular activities
4. Community service
5. Work experience
6. Letters of recommendation (2)
 - a. One from your high school staff {teacher, counselor}
 - b. One from a community member (employer, church etc.)

Submit a copy of your high school transcript with this application.

Incomplete applications will not be considered.
