Apply for Summer 2017. You will be carried over to Fall 2017.

If you have applied previously, update your application on eServices for Summer



Multiple Measures Assessment

Instead of the Standard Computer Based Assessment, Palomar will be utilizing the Multiple Measures Assessment:

Overall HS GPA

Last English/Math Course Taken

Grade in the Last Course

Scores on Other Tests (ACT, SAT,
AP, CSU EAP, etc.)

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What Has Exempted You From Taking the EAP Test?

AP English Lit or Lang: 3 or higher

SAT Writing: 500 or higher

ACT Writing: 22 or higher

CSU EPT: 147 or higher

CSU EAP: Ready for college level English

AP Calc AB or BC: 3 or higher

AP Stats: 3 or higher

SAT Math: 550 or higher

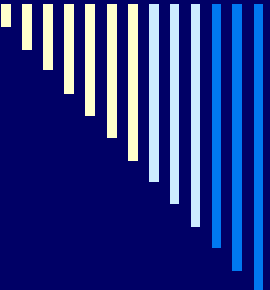
ACT Math: 23 or higher

CSU ELM: 49 or higher

CSU EAP: Ready for college level math

CSU EAP: Ready for college level math, Conditional.

The Assessment Center will also accept the following documentation for English, reading and math placement.

Completed English and/or Math courses at other colleges

A score of 3 or higher on AP English and/or Math tests

Other college placement test results if taken in within the last two years

Test results from SAT, ACT, CAASPP, CSU EAP, ELM and/or EPT taken within the last two years

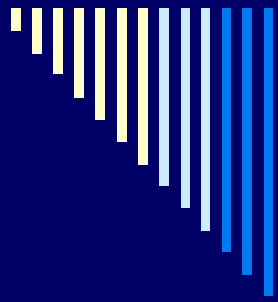


Financial Aid

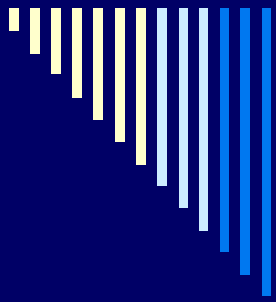
