Schultz also served as Assistant Principal of Student Activities and then as front office Assistant Principal at Bonita Vista High School for five years. He then moved to East Lake Middle School as an Assistant Principal for one year, and for the past four years he served as a Principal in the Cajon Valley Union District at both Fuerte Elementary School and Montgomery Middle School.
